November Book Review

Orphan Train by Christina Baker Kline

Between 1854 and 1929, so-called orphan trains ran regularly from the cities of the East coast to the farmlands of the Midwest, carrying thousands of abandoned children whose fates would be determined by pure luck. As a young Irish immigrant, Vivian Daly was one such child, sent by rail from New York City to an uncertain future a world away.



Christina Baker Kline weaves a beautiful story of two women, Vivian who is 91 and Molly who is 17. She has also spent her youth in and out of foster homes raised by strangers. I just loved this book! I loved journeying with them through their heartbreak! It is a powerful story of personal upheaval and resilience, second chances, and unexpected friendship!
