Our Kits for Kids provide personal hygiene and basic "medicine cabinet" items that are scarce in the developing world. If a child gets hurt, families might have to travel a long distance by bicycle, bus or even on foot to receive care at the nearest hospital or medical clinic. Working with pediatricians and nurses, Project C.U.R.E. developed Kits for Kids to give parents in developing countries the supplies they need to provide basic care at home. A bar of soap encourages hand washing, too. Kits for Kids is a great service learning project or family activity! Project Cure is the largest provider of medical equipment and supplies in the world

Burn ointment	Tweezers
Elastic bandage	Sunscreen
