### **JOIN US FOR *SPOON RIVER ANTHOLOGY* by Edgar Lee Masters**

At Gamma Gamma's first meeting, **Thursday, September 17<sup>th</sup>**, the program will be an Illinois Humanities Council Road Scholar Presentation by Paddy & Jon Lynn and Patti Ecker. 2015 marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the publication of the ***Spoon River Anthology*** by Edgar Lee Masters. To this day, no other literary work from Illinois has had an impact more radical than that of the ***Spoon River Anthology***. In Masters' 243 thinly veiled epitaph-poems, people from all walks of life come forward from their graves and share compelling stories of their hopes, dreams, tragedies, and joys, not to mention their advice and warnings to those still living. The uproar that Masters' book created because of its unique free verse style and its portrayal of characters with blunt and brutal honesty caused a scandal upon its debut. As a result, it was banned from the Spoon River area schools and libraries until 1974. The stories capture all aspects of life - irony, comedy, failure, and success. These dramatized monologues portrayed by one actor and actress, will not only reflect on the life and times of those living in 1915, but also offer universal lessons to Illinoisans living today. Accomplished folk musician Patti Ecker provides musical interludes appropriate to the subject matter and historical period.

Before the program, we will have a very full meeting that will begin with the initiation of two new members. Each of our committees will briefly report on the Plan of Work they have developed for the upcoming year. Also, please remember to bring any 'good reads' you wish to pass on to other members via our book exchange.
